WASTEWATER TREATMENT

Imagine your world without any of these commonly used and consumed products: Laundry detergent, fabric softer, dishwashing liquid, body wash, bubble bath, shampoo, conditioner, cosmetics, lotion, soap, toothpaste, bug repellent, antibiotics, pain and fever reducers, caffeine, and disinfectants. We use many if not all these products daily, but do you ever wonder what happens to them after the bubbles and rinse water go down the drain?

I recently attended a presentation given by Dr. Liyuan Hou, Assistant Professor at the Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering, at Utah State University. She has researched how wastewater treatment plants (WWTP) receive complex mixtures of these contaminants and how they affect microorganisms. Results from samples taken from two WWTP plants here in the State of Utah show that acetaminophen was most abundant, followed by caffeine, sulfamethoxazole, DEET, and gemfibrozil. The good news for water quality is that significant reductions were observed for most of the individual compounds following biological treatment.

There is a common adage that goes, "The solution to pollution is dilution". This implies that the negative effects of something that is harmful or destructive can be resolved if we just dilute it enough. What if everyone did the same thing at the same time in our communities? Eventually the dilution factor is lost, and the negative effects rear their ugly heads. Keep in mind the best practice when using any of these products is: Use only the amount that is necessary, use as directed, and use proper disposal practices.
