MAYOR'S COMMENTS

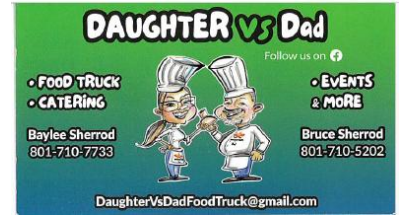
I would like to thank all the volunteers that will help put on our Independence Day celebration again this year. It really takes the entire

DEPARTMENTS

POLICE –Please make sure your vehicles and outer buildings are locked. Our neighboring cities have had recent burglaries. Report anything suspicious to Dispatch at 435-723-6890. Due to summer, there is a lot more foot traffic at all hours of the day. Drivers, please watch for pedestrians and bicycles.

FIRE- Discharging fireworks is restricted east of Highway 89. See www.willardcity.com for further information.

ALL burning has been suspended in Box Elder County due to high heat and low humidity. The ban includes agricultural, residential, and open burning.

Heat and low humidity means weeds are flourishing. Please take time to keep weeds trimmed to 6 inches in height. This will reduce fire hazards and make neighbors happy. Weeds that aren't maintained can be considered a public nuisance. Weed maintenance is the responsibility of property owners. Willard doesn't have the resources to remove weeds on private property.

Extreme heat poses health risks. Residents are urged to stay hydrated, take breaks in the shade, and check on vulnerable individuals.

ADMIN – Willard City Code 16.12.010 makes it unlawful for any person to own, keep, harbor, or maintain a dog over the age of six months without registering or obtaining a license. Licenses must be renewed every calendar year. This year, Willard has a lot of dogs that still aren't licenses. Licenses can be renewed online.
